# **Request to Dorchester Town Council to Support New Parking Restrictions**

Parking Issue:	I am contacting you on behalf of Weldmar Hospicecare. We are becoming increasingly concerned about the number of cars consistently parking outside the entrance of our Inpatient Unit on Herringston Road. It is not unusual for cars to be parked from the start of the allotments pass the Winterbourne Hospital and across the entrance area of our hospice site. When cars park on the road and opposite our junction, it causes high visibility issues and we have most recently witnesses several occasions where users of our site have experienced issues exiting our site, many of which have nearly experienced collisions. This has become even more challenging since the Winterbourne Hospital has introduced their own parking restrictions on site. Please could double yellow lines be considered for this stretch of road, particularly the areas adjacent to the entrance of our site. With vulnerable patients and visitors coming on and off site throughout each day, it could be catastrophic if there was to be an accident.

Parking restriction Double yellow lines opposite the hospice grounds entrance requested (including plan/map and site details): Please provide evidence of support by other local residents: Our initial request was sent to the highways officer, who replied on 20th Please provide evidence of support January confirming that they had looked at the parking situation and from ward agreed that this road is concerning. It was confirmed that they agreed to councillors and find it was a reasonable request to have double yellow line in the area and statutory authorities: that the process needed to start with the town council.
